Project Location Information

Location: Meskwaki Indian Settlement in central Iowa near the community of Tama

River Basin(s): Iowa / Cedar

State(s): IA

Status

The Study, as amended, was completed June 2003.

Description

The Sac & Fox Tribe of the Mississippi in Iowa is located on the Meskwaki Indian Settlement in central Iowa near the community of Tama. The Tribe owns over 7,000 acres of land near the Iowa River and has a Tribal membership of approximately 1,200. The Rock Island District has been working with the Tribe for several years, primarily under the Planning Assistance to States (PAS) and Floodplain Management Services Programs. A PAS Floodplain Study of the Tribal lands was completed in 1998. The Tribe subsequently identified the development of: 1) an implementation plan for a Geographic Information System (GIS); 2) a housing inventory, and; 3) an updated boundary survey as additional needs.

The Tribe has expressed interest in meeting additional Tribal water resource planning needs utilizing the Corps' Planning Assistance to States and Tribes, Section 22 Authority.
