Status

The Rock Island District's Planning Assistance to States (PAS) program has been very successful in assisting other agencies, States, counties, local communities and Indian tribes with planning related to water resources issues and needs. A growing demand exists for the District's planning assistance services to assist with concerns for: Water supply, water quality, water conservation, storm water management, watershed analysis, wetlands evaluation/studies, dam safety, floodplain management, and harbor and port studies.

Description

The Planning Assistance to States (PAS) Program provides States, counties, local communities and Indian tribes with planning level assistance in addressing a range of water resources issues and needs. The studies generally involve the analysis of existing data for planning purposes using standard engineering techniques but may also involve the collection of data to perform analysis. The program provides the sponsor with planning level detail and information which then becomes the basis for future planning decisions by the sponsor. This program is not intended to produce detailed plans and specifications for project construction.
