LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION: East Boyer and Boyer Rivers at Denison, IA, are located in Crawford County, approximately 60 miles northeast of Omaha, NE. The Denison Flood Protection Project will construct a right bank levee and floodwall along the East Boyer River to reduce recurring flooding problems in the City of Denison, Iowa.

PROBLEM AND NEED: Flood damages along East Boyer River. The City of Denison has suffered significant damages from floods, as recently as 1990, 1991, 1993, and 1996. The flooding affects residential areas, commercial and light industrial zones. The largest of these occurrences in terms of damage, depth of water, and discharge was the July 8 and 9, 1993 flood. The locations within the city of Denison enduring the most considerable damages during both the 1993 and 1996 floods include U.S. Highway 30, North 7th Street and State Highway 39. These areas combined for almost \$10 million in documented damages in 1993 and \$4 million in documented damages in 1996. The project will protect residential, commercial, and light industrial areas of Denison, Iowa from flooding, up to the 1% flood (100-year).

PROPOSED ACTIVITIES FOR FY08: Contract closeout, Real Estate crediting, and project close-out are scheduled for completion in FY08.

ISSUES AND OTHER INFORMATION: The floodwall contract option was awarded on October 20, 2006 for \$424,000 utilizing FY07 Continuing Authority funding. Remaining FY07 amount will be used to fund contract modifications, construction contract supervision and administration labor, engineering & design during construction labor, and Real Estate crediting labor. Construction will be completed in FY07.
