The proposed site appears to be within approximately 350 feet of the Maple River. There likely will not be a discharge to a water of the U.S. during development or the pump test as the alfalfa field can be used as an infiltration area. If there has been significant precipitation, the river is flooding, or the ground is frozen, the discharge may flow to the river and a general permit #6 (GP6) will be required.

The site is in the floodplain and it was reported that the wellhead will be located on a berm similar to the existing wells.
