North Overlook Beach (updated 2016)

Features:

- Parking for 230+ vehicles
- Concession building
- Volleyball courts (2)
Volleyballs may be checked out at the concession building when open or bring your own.
- Family restroom facilities with showers
- Outdoor wash off shower stations
- Picnic Area
- Bike rack
- Bench seating areas
- Drinking fountains

Rules:

- No Alcohol in Designated Area (see map below)
- No Pets
- No Glass
- Use Waste Receptacles
- No Fires

Caution:

- No lifeguard on duty.

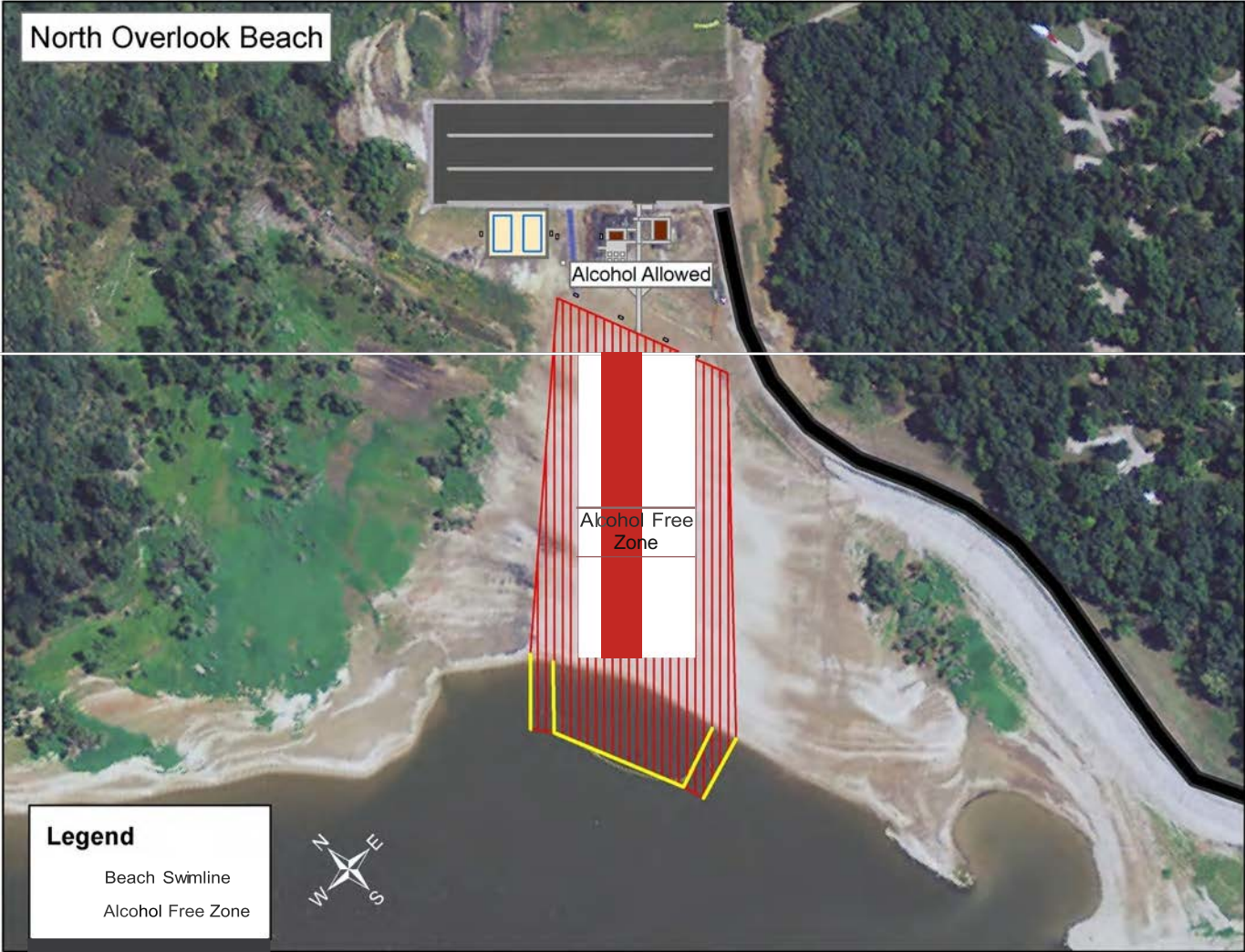


North Overlook Beach is a high-water beach and does not close due to elevated lake levels.

Availability

North Overlook Beach will be open to visitors from: **Late April – September**

Day-Use Fees

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers managed beaches such as North Overlook and Whitebreast both require payment of a daily fee of \$2.00 for walk-in or bike-in visitors, or \$5.00 per car unless posted otherwise. Visitors under 16 years of age do not need to pay the day use fee.

Registered campers from U.S. Army Corps of Engineers managed campgrounds are not required to pay day-use fees at beaches or boat ramps if displaying a camping pass.

America the Beautiful Senior or Access Cardholders do not need to pay day use fees.

Annual Pass

Purchasing an Annual Pass permits a visitor to use U.S. Army Corps of Engineers managed swimming beaches and boat ramps without further charge for one year.

Annual Passes can be purchased for \$40.00 at U.S. Army Corps of Engineers managed campground fee booths or the Lake Red Rock Project Office.
