- **B.** Typical year assessment(s): The US Drought Monitor shows parts of Clayton County, IA as being Abnormally Dry, but they City of Guttenberg is in a part of Clayton County that has no drought or dry conditions. The APT Tool listed this area as having wetter than normal conditions.
- **C.** Additional comments to support AJD: A comprehensive GIS investigation was completed on this AJD site, utilizing tools such as the NWI, NHD, topographic, aerials, and other online maps. There are

no previously documented waters on this site, and most online GIS sites did not indicate wetlands are on site, but as the NRCS Soil Survey showed the project area as 100% hydric soils, a site visit was conducted. Three data points were completed, and none of the data points had hydric soils or enough hydrology indicators for there to be wetlands on this site. This area is actively mowed. There is a levee just offsite preventing floodwaters from reaching this site.
